Cultural centres Kanneltalo, Malmitalo, Stoa and Vuotalo are home to many City of Helsinki services: the library, cultural services, youth services and the Helsinki Finnish Adult Education Centre. This vision is pursued with residents and partners.

The City of Helsinki's cultural centres Kanneltalo, Malmitalo, Stoa and Vuotalo are located in rapidly growing and changing areas, the positive development of which the City wants to invest in. The need for a new vision was born out of the cultural centres' desire to be important and accessible places for more and more people living near them. The formulation

of the vision was contributed to by approximately 2,400 city residents and 300 operators from the cultural centres' local neighbourhoods. The new vision for the cultural centres can be summed up as "Let's make the centre of your life together!" Through it, we invite city residents to get involved, celebrate local stories and cultures and meet one another.

Why will we continue to be important in the 2030s?

Cultural centres Kanneltalo, Malmitalo, Stoa and Vuotalo are distinctive shared spaces that contribute to the development of their districts. They add meaning to people's lives through culture, art, creativity, learning, physical activity and togetherness and make residents stronger as individuals and communities to face the future.

Encounters between people are what make districts vibrant and welcoming and the people living in them more important to each other – without requiring people to be the same. The cultural centres facilitate a sense of belonging in everyday life and also provide a space for processing phenomena and challenges. They allow people to pursue the art of living together through actions and constant practise.

How we do this:


- The diversity of local areas and the backgrounds of their residents are reflected in the cultural centres.

Experience art and culture

How we do this:

- We highlight local rising stars and stories.
- We emphasise opportunities for participation, community art and arts education.
- We invite audiences who rarely seek out culture to join in.
- We surprise you.

Learn, do, create and move

We offer a wide range of activities to engage in – together or alone, persistently or occasionally. We are an inspiring learning environment.

How we do this:

- We encourage people to get moving and try new things.
- We make our activities as easy as possible to join.
- We offer equipment and spaces for independent activities.
- We facilitate encounters during activities.
- We provide opportunities for language learning.



Priorities of the vision

Ask for and receive help

We are a helpful neighbour. We strengthen everyone's opportunities and active role in society.

How we do this:

- We keep people involved in society by providing digital advice and opportunities to update your competence.
- We are a point of contact with the City of Helsinki and Finnish society.

The areas around Kanneltalo, Malmitalo, Stoa and Vuotalo are connected by rapid development and strong local characteristics, networks and phenomena.

Because of this, we want to invite residents to get involved and strengthen efforts stemming from the local communities of the neighbourhoods.

Inclusion is also strongly linked to democracy and the realisation of civil rights. It is a counterforce to inequality and marginalisation. Each resident is an expert on their own daily life. In order for the cultural centres to develop along with their neighbourhoods, they need to engage in constant interaction and collaboration with local residents, operators and partners.

How the vision was born

The vision for cultural centres Kanneltalo, Malmitalo, Stoa and Vuotalo is the end result of multi-faceted collaboration. The vision is based on the thoughts of residents and stakeholders, which have been processed by the staff, management and specialists of the cultural centres.
