TERMS OF USE

1. Starting from summer 2014, trade tables are no longer sold in advance from the office at Hietalahti Market Hall.
You may only purchase a trade table in advance online or from the customer service of the Wholesale Market.
You may purchase an extra table from the Square Master on the trade day. On the trade day, you may purchase remaining free trade tables online or from the Square Master at the market.
2. The table is personal. It is not possible to change or cancel a reserved table or to transfer it to a third party.
3. If you have paid for your table in advance, you can go to prepare it one hour before the flea market opens, at the earliest.
4. You have to leave the market every day half an hour after the flea market has closed, at the latest.
5. A flea market table is granted people over 16-years-old in age. On the trade day, the vendor has to prove his or her identity and, upon request, present a receipt or the email confirmation of the paid table.
6. Flea market tables are only intended for the sale of used goods. The vendors are not permitted to purchase products from the customers. It is also prohibited to purchase goods from another flea market vendor with the intention of placing them on sale at the Hietalahti Flea Market during the same trade week. It is not allowed to sell new products, flowers, foodstuffs or animals at the flea market. Products made of precious metals can only be traded in accordance with the terms stated in the Act on Precious Metals (no. 1029/1 December 2000 and decree no. 1148/2000).
7. The selling of pornographic materials at the flea market is strictly prohibited.
8. All products on sale must be products the vendor or his/her household has utilised.
9. The square masters have the right to demand that products, which do not fulfil these terms, be removed from sale. The said products must immediately be removed from the trade table. In exceptions, the representative of Helsinki Wholesale Market may grant a permission to sell new products. This permission is only granted to asso-

ciations and societies etc. for selling surplus campaign items.

10. The permit holder must be in the square lot allocated to him/her in the trade permit. The products on sale, the table and possible racks, as well as other equipment used in trading, must be within the limits of the allocated lot.
11. Cars must not be parked on the market area for other purposes than unloading and loading the goods.
12. After the trading hours, the permit holder must return the trade table to the table cage.
13. The permit holder must adhere to these rules and regulations set by the authorities or the representative of the City of Helsinki. They have the right to remove a vendor, who does not adhere to the set rules or regulations or who, otherwise, is not suited to trading at the flea market. If the permit holder does not adhere to the abovementioned rules and regulations, the Helsinki Wholesale Market has the right to refuse to rent a flea market table to that person.
14. The basic goal of flea market activities is to recycle goods, due to which unsold flea market goods must not be left at the market or in the city's waste containers. Instead, the vendor must transport unsold goods away or to donate them to the clothes container of the Salvation Army, next to the market square.
15. In connection to making the reservation, the personal information of the customer will be recorded into the data system used by the Wholesale Market. The register statement of the data system is available from the customer service of the Wholesale Market or online at the address www.hel.fi/rekisteriseloste.

Note! The professional trade of used goods is a business activity, in which case, the capital gain is subject to taxation. The vendors are obligated to find out whether their operations are counted as business operations. The Helsinki Wholesale Market gives the data of flea market vendors to the authorities, upon request.
