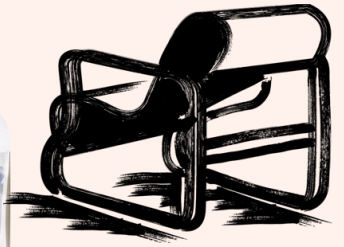

3 Wellbeing that works

In Helsinki, everyday life runs smoothly. Public transport gets you where you're going, schools serve every child a warm meal, and healthcare is there when you need it. Things just work – quietly, reliably, without fuss.

And when the basics are taken care of, there's room for what really matters. Time with family and friends. A moment to slow down. A sauna that resets both body and mind. In Helsinki, wellbeing isn't a luxury – it's the foundation that makes life feel balanced and free.

Science backs what Helsinkians have always known: sauna is good for you. Studies show it lowers stress, boosts mood, and even helps the body recover. Add a cold plunge in winter, and you get a natural reset that's as much about community as health. Sauna has been part of Finnish culture for thousands of years – and it still shapes everyday life in Helsinki.

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Did you know that

The city has 35 official beaches, 16 swimming halls, and 21 winter swimming spots for year-round dips. There are 13 indoor skating rinks and 165 outdoor rinks, plus 92 dog parks (yes, really) and 72 nature reserve areas.

Getting around is easy with 668 km of footpaths and 1,300 km of cycling routes. And if you prefer life on water, there are 12,000 mooring spots for leisure boats.

End your workday on time and head straight for a [swim](#), or a [park picnic](#). Just because you can.

Belonging in Helsinki isn't about blending in, but about having the freedom to be yourself.

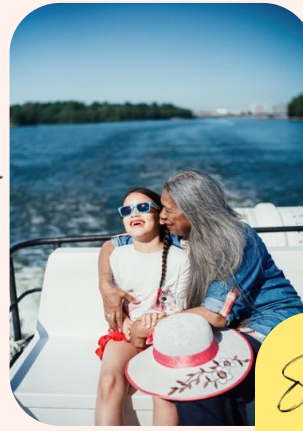
Everyday life here is designed to make space for everyone – because in Helsinki, every voice counts.

5 Tomorrow's innovation today

From quantum computing breakthroughs and next-gen AI models to advanced deep tech tackling global challenges, Helsinki is where innovation starts and scales.

At the national level, Finland's upcoming tax reform will lower corporate tax to 18% by 2027, reduce income tax for key international talent, and streamline regulations to make cross-border VC investments faster and easier.

At the city level, the Helsinki Innovation Fund provides direct funding for pilot projects, deep tech experimentation, and public-private co-creation – turning the city into a real-world testbed for frontier technologies.

Whether you're growing a quantum lab, deploying AI at scale, or investing in hard tech with long horizons, Helsinki offers the infrastructure, talent, and political will to make an impact in the world.

From producing protein from CO₂ and electricity (Solar Foods) to building Europe's first large language model (Silo.AI) – everything started from Helsinki.

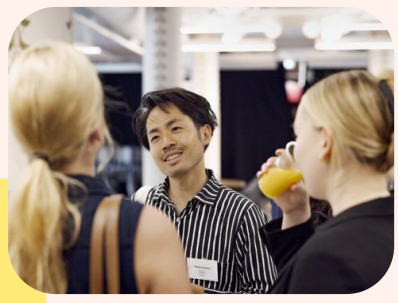

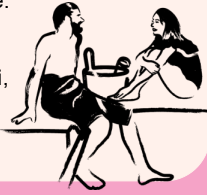
Helsinki is the birthplace of Tove Jansson, the creator of Moomins – who are the true ambassadors of happiness.

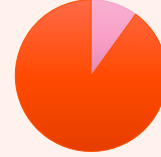
