

## Do you suspect a coronavirus infection?

On the Omaolo-service you will, on the grounds of your symptoms, get instructions on what to do. If needed, you can make an appointment to a coronavirus test at the service (on Finnish and Swedish pages).

Helsinki Coronavirus helpline and the Medical helpline will refer you to a coronavirus test or to a corona health station.

Every person with coronavirus symptoms are referred to a coronavirus test. These symptoms are respiratory infection, diarrhoea or stomach ache. Symptoms of respiratory infection are fever, cough, sore throat, snuffles, shortness of breath and loss of sense of smell or taste.

There are coronavirus testing points in different parts of the city. The test tells if you have the coronavirus infection. At the testing points there is no antibody test, which would tell if you already have had the infection.

**All coronavirus patients are treated at Laakso and Malmi - call first**

All Helsinki patients needing medical assessment of their respiratory infection are directed to the Corona health stations. Patients with respiratory infection symptoms are not treated at other health stations.

Call first the Coronavirus helpline or the Medical helpline. You will get instructions on telephone.

At corona health stations, clients are treated in order of medical urgency. There is no appointments booking to the corona health stations.

In most cases the infection is healed within a week at home, without medical care. The symptoms can be eased with painkillers.
