

The rates of the City of Helsinki's environmental health care starting from 1 March 2024

1 § Scope of application

These rates apply to:

A) The work performances of a municipal authority defined in the Food Act (297/2021) that are related to

- 1) the processing of notifications related to registration referred to in sections 10 and 13, and the processing of applications and notifications concerning approval specified in sections 9 and 11
- 2) inspections and sample analyses related to activities specified in section 72, subsection 1, included in the municipal control plan
- 3) inspections carried out to ensure compliance with a formal request referred to in section 40, subsection 1
- 4) supervision of operators exporting food outside the European Union as referred to in section 51, subsection 1, and export certificates referred to in subsection 2 of the same section
- 5) inspections carried out to ensure compliance with administrative enforcement measures and sanctions issued due to non-compliance with food legislation as referred to in chapter 9 of the Food Act.

No fees will be charged for planned control inspections of registered primary production. If a reinspection of registered primary production must be carried out based on neglect, an inspection fee will be charged. No fees specified in paragraphs 1 and 2 will be charged to food aid operators.

In addition to these, the municipality will charge a fee for other controls and related inspections and investigations as provided in Articles 79 to 85 of Regulation 2017/625 of the European Parliament and of the Council (hereinafter referred to as the Official Controls Regulation).

B) The work performances of a municipal authority defined in the Health Protection Act (763/1994, section 50 a) that are related to

- 6) the processing of notifications referred to in sections 13 and 18 a, the processing of applications concerning approval specified in section 18, and inspections and document inspections of activities specified in said sections that are included in the municipal control plan referred to in section 6
- 7) the supervision of orders given based on notifications submitted under section 13 and applications submitted under section 18
- 8) measurements, samplings, analyses and investigations of activities specified in paragraph 6 that are carried out to investigate health hazards or ensure that such hazards have been removed

- 9) the approval of risk assessments referred to in section 20 and the control and monitoring of household water quality
- 10) the control of swimming water as defined in section 29
- 11) inspections (inspections of ships) and the granting of certificates as referred to in section 6, subsection 4
- 12) inspections of solarium devices as referred to in section 173 of the Radiation Act (859/2018)
- 13) household water analyses charged to the owner of a well in cases in which the area does not constitute a water distribution area referred to in section 16, subsection 4, of the Health Protection Act (an area subject to value added tax).

Other work performances subject to the approved rates that are related to

- 14) inspections, document inspections, measurements, samplings, analyses and investigations performed in apartments or other living premises to investigate health hazards referred to in section 26 the Health Protection Act or to ensure that such hazards have been removed; these work performances will be charged to the property owner, holder or another party responsible for the health hazard under section 27; however, no fee will be charged for the first inspection by an authority to investigate a health hazard in an apartment and assess the need for further investigations
- 15) measures related to the transfer of corpses referred to in the agreement on the transfer of corpses (Finnish Treaty Series 13/1989) and control visits or inspections under the Decree adopted pursuant to section 43 of the Health Protection Act
- 16) inspections related to the supervision of compliance with provisions adopted pursuant to chapter 17 of the Environmental Protection Act (527/2014)
- 17) inspections, document inspections, measurements, samplings, analyses and investigations other than those referred to in paragraphs 14 and 15 that are carried out to investigate health hazards or ensure that such hazards have been removed.

If the measurements, samplings, analyses and investigations can also be commissioned from

an external party, the fees will be subject to value added tax.

C) The work performances of a municipal authority defined in the Tobacco Act (549/2016) that are related to

- 18) the processing of applications concerning retail licences referred to in section 44
- 19) the processing of notifications concerning the retail sale of nicotine-containing liquids referred to in section 48
- 20) the processing of wholesale notifications referred to in section 50
- 21) the processing of applications concerning smoking bans referred to in section 79
- 22) the annual supervision fee for sales licences referred to in section 91.

D) The work performances of a municipal authority defined in the Medicines Act (395/1987) that are related to

23) the granting of retail licences for nicotine products as referred to in section 54 a

24) control measures referred to in section 54 c.

2 § Basis for determining fees

- 2.1 The fees are based on the average total costs of control, travel, inspections, sampling and sample analysis incurred by the authority, as well as on the Tobacco Act.
- 2.2 Total costs include operational costs, interest, depreciation and a share of the administrative costs. The hourly price of control personnel is EUR 70.
- 2.3 The fees for external services and laboratory analyses are determined based on the costs accrued.
- 2.4 Fees will be charged in accordance with the attached fee tables.
- 2.5 A separate fee for sampling under the Food Act will not be charged as it is included in the basic annual control fee. The analysis of food samples is subject to a fee unless otherwise decided on the grounds of fairness.
- 2.6 Sampling and sample analysis under the Health Protection Act are subject to a fee unless otherwise decided on the grounds of fairness.

3 § Processing and approval fees

This section applies to the processing fees for notifications referred to in sections 10 and 13 of the Food Act and those for applications and notifications referred to in sections 9 and 11 of the same act, the processing fees for notifications referred to in section 13 of the Health Protection Act, the approval fees for facilities specified in section 18 of the Health Protection Act and the processing fees for housing corporations' smoking ban applications under section 79 of the Tobacco Act.

- 3.1 The general principle for determining a processing or approval fee is the extent of the processing or approval procedure. The fee will be determined based on the working hours spent processing the application or notification.
- The processing of notifications referred to in sections 10 and 13 of the Food Act and of notifications referred to in section 13 of the Health Protection Act includes reviewing the information related to the notification, entering the information into the authority's system for controlled sites, conducting a preliminary risk assessment and sending the certification to the operator.
- The working hours spent processing applications or notifications specified in sections 9 and 11 of the Food Act and approvals of facilities specified in section 18 of the Health Protection Act include the premises' commissioning inspection, reviewing the related documents, entering the information into the authority's system for controlled sites, a preliminary risk assessment, processing the application and the approval decision.

The working hours spent processing applications concerning housing corporations' smoking bans specified in section 79 of the Tobacco Act include reviewing the related documents, processing the application, hearing the concerned parties and preparing the banning decision. In addition to the processing fee based on the application's processing time, any costs related to the hearing of the concerned parties and notifying them of the decision, such as postal fees and notification costs, will be charged.

- 3.2 The processing or approval fee will also be applied to notifications or applications concerning a significant change to the operations and notifications related to a change in operator. Regarding activities referred to in the Food Act, a fee will also be charged for processing notifications concerning closing down operations.
- 3.3 The approval fee will also be applied to conditional approval decisions defined in the Food Act. A fee for new operations will be charged for the first conditional approval, and a fee for a significant change will be charged for the following conditional approvals in accordance with the attached fee table.

4 § Inspection fees included in the control plan of environmental health care

- 4.1 A control fee will be charged for an inspection and sampling based on an approved control plan. This fee will be determined on the basis of the time spent. The inspection includes preparing for the inspection, the average travel time, the inspection and writing the inspection report. The inspection can also be an inspection or a document inspection carried out by phone or other remote means of communication without visiting the site.
- The City of Helsinki's control plan and quality system for environmental health care determine the content of the inspections as well as the average time required for the different types of control sites. The inspection frequency of a site is determined based on a risk assessment. If various operations take place in food premises, the inspection frequency and fee will be based on the operations with the highest risks.
- 4.2 One combined fee will be charged for inspection assignments that take place simultaneously at one control site. If several inspections based on environmental healthcare legislation are performed at the site during the same inspection visit, the fee will be charged based on the main inspection, and an additional 50% of the fees for the simultaneous inspections will be added to this.
- 4.3 No separate fee will be charged for inspections of retail and wholesale outlets of tobacco products and nicotine-containing liquids included in the control plan, nor for inspections of smoking bans and restrictions. The annual supervision fees for tobacco products, nicotine-containing liquids, and the retail sales and wholesale of nicotine products cover all the planned inspections.

5 § Fees charged for other inspections under the Food Act

- 5.1 A separate fee will be charged for the supervision of food premises exporting foodstuffs outside the European Union if the export operations require more comprehensive supervision based on the requirements of the purchasing

country. The fee will be determined based on the time spent on the inspections.

- 5.2 Fees for inspections that may be based on supervising the measures defined in sections

55 to 61 and 66 of the Food Act will be based on the costs accrued.

- 5.3 Furthermore, a fee will also be charged for other controls and related investigative

measures as laid down in Articles 79 to 85 of the Official Controls Regulation. This also applies to inspections carried out at food premises upon the operator's request before the operations are initiated, as well as to inspections not included in the control plan carried out to ensure that any defects are rectified. However, no fee will be charged for inspections based on a notification of suspicion unless the inspection in question is a reinspection performed due to non-compliance with regulations. In addition, a fee will be charged for other measures carried out because of non-compliance with regulations, such as a prohibition issued to an operator due to the markings of foodstuff batches or the disposal of foodstuffs.

- 5.4 A cost-based fee will be charged for export certificates of foodstuffs.

- 5.5 A separate fee will be charged for the control of the internal market import of foodstuffs

governed by Regulation (EC) No. 1688/2005 implementing the regulation on special guarantees concerning salmonella.

6 § Fees charged for certain inspections and measurements under the Health Protection Act

- 6.1 A cost-based fee will be charged for inspections, measurements, samplings, analyses and

investigations carried out to investigate a health hazard defined in section 27 of the Health

Protection Act, or to ensure that such a health hazard has been removed, in accordance

with the fee table attached.

- 6.2 The first inspection to investigate a health hazard is free of charge.

7 § Sales licence fee and annual supervision fee under the Tobacco Act and the Medicines Act

- 7.1 A fee will be charged for processing applications for retail licences for tobacco products, nicotine-containing liquids and nicotine products, processing retail and wholesale notifications for nicotine liquids and their annual supervision in accordance with the fee table attached.

If the retail sale of tobacco products and nicotine-containing liquids is fixed-term and lasts less than six months, the annual supervision fee charged will be 50% of the total fee. The sum of the annual supervision fee depends on the number of points of sale available at the sales outlet.

8 § Determination of control fees in special cases and moderation of fees

- 8.1 If an inspection included in the control plan or the processing of a notification or an application requires an exceptionally small or large amount of work, the fee charged can be a maximum of 50% lower or higher than the fee determined in section 2.
- 8.2 If applying these rates results in a clearly unfair situation considering the nature and significance of the matter, it is possible in certain special cases to charge a fee that is lower than presented in the rates, or it can be decided not to charge the fee. However, as a rule, the processing fee of a notification or application must still be at least 50% of the fee that would be charged.
- 8.3 Decisions concerning changes in the amount of control fees charged or changes in the processing fees for notifications and applications will be made by the Urban Environment Committee's Environment and Permits Subcommittee on matters within its scope of operations, and by the officeholders of Environmental Services on matters within their decision-making power.

9 § Cancellation or expiry of applications or notifications

- 9.1 If an applicant cancels their application or notification, or if the processing of the matter expires within the municipal authority for some other reason before the decision or certificate has been granted, and the authority has taken some significant measures to process the application or notification in question, the fee will be charged based on the time spent on the processing.

10 § Rejection of applications, inadmissibility of applications or notifications

- 10.1 If an application has been rejected, or if the operations under the Health Protection Act specified in the notification are prohibited, a fee will be charged in accordance with these rates. If the grounds for the rejection or prohibition indicate clearly enough that there is no basis for more extensive processing of the matter, the fee will be determined based on the time spent on the processing.
- 10.2 If it has been decided that an application will not be investigated, a fee will not be charged.

11 § Processing fee for returned applications

- 11.1 If a court of law decides, upon an appeal, to reopen the processing of a matter, the sum charged for the control authority's decision pertaining to the same matter will be deducted from the fee charged in accordance with these rates.
- 11.2 If a court of law decides, upon an appeal, to nullify a decision on the grounds that the applicant has no need for the approval decision they applied for, any fees charged will be returned in full.

12 § Payment of fees and debt collection

- 12.1 A fee specified in the control plan will be charged for an inspection performed, excluding
- the inspections of retail outlets of tobacco products and nicotine-containing liquids and of smoking bans and restrictions under the Tobacco Act, as well as the inspections of sales outlets of nicotine products under the Medicines Act.
- 12.2 Fees must be paid on the due date stated in the invoice, at the latest. The due date cannot be earlier than two weeks after receiving the invoiced service.
- 12.3 If the fee determined for a measure carried out has not been paid by the due date, the debtor must pay annual interest for late payment for the delayed amount in accordance with the interest rate defined in section 4 of the Interest Act (633/1982). If the sum of the interest rate remains below EUR 5, a late-payment fee of EUR 5 will be charged instead.
- 12.4 If a fee determined in these rates has not been paid despite reminders, it can be
- collected through distraint measures without a separate verdict or decision in the order
- determined in the Act on the Enforcement of Taxes and Public Payments (706/2007)
- (section 74 of the Food Act, section 50 b of the Health Protection Act, section 25 b of the Tobacco Act and section 54 d of the Medicines Act).
- 12.5 The annual supervision fee for retail and wholesale outlets of tobacco products and nicotine-containing liquids will be charged per calendar year. The date of determination of the fee will be the date of issue of the licence in the first year and 1 January in subsequent years. If the date of starting the operations stated in an application is later than 1 December, no annual supervision fee will be charged for the year of issuing the sales licence. The charging of the annual supervision fee for retail and wholesale outlets of tobacco products and nicotine-containing liquids will be stopped when the licence expires. Fees charged will not be refunded.
- 12.6 The annual supervision fee for retail licences for nicotine products as determined in the Medicines Act
- will be charged per calendar year. The date of determination of the fee will be the date of issue of the licence in the first year and 1 January in subsequent years. If the date of starting the operations stated in an application is later than 1 December, no annual supervision fee will be charged for the year of issuing the sales licence. The charging of the annual supervision fee for a retail licence for nicotine products will be stopped when the licence expires. Fees charged will not be refunded.

13 § Entry into force

- 13.1 Fees will be determined based on the rates in force on the date the decision is made, or the matter is processed.

- 13.2 The annual supervision fee for retail and wholesale outlets of tobacco products and nicotine-containing liquids will be determined based on the rates in force at the time of review of the fee.
- 13.3 These rates will come into force on 1 March 2024.
